

Reporting officer had contacted Evans' attorney, Charles Shaw, to advise him that the x-rays will be done at approximately 1:00 p.m. at Barnes Hospital.</p> <p>Evans was handcuffed and shackled and placed into a marked squad car. Evans was transported to Barnes Hospital by reporting officer and Detective Marc McLemore.</p> <p>Reporting officer did advise Evans, prior to leaving the Madison County Jail, that no conversation of the pending case against him would take place. It should be noted that during the transport of Evans, general conversation did take place however, no questioning about Evans' case took place.</p> <p>After arriving at Barnes Hospital, detectives escorted Evans to the radiology department. At approximately 1:00 p.m., a representative from Attorney Charles Shaw's office, showed up. The attorney identified himself as Bradley Herrin. In the presence of reporting officer, Detective McLemore, and Attorney Brad Herrin, the x-rays of Evans' right and left hands were obtained. The x-rays were then read by Doctor Louis Gilula, 314-362-2911.</p> <p>After Dr. Gilula examines the x-rays, the doctor did find evidence of an old fracture on Evans' hands. The doctor then identified the fracture as the one that reporting officer had obtained from St. Anthony's Hospital when Evans broke his hand in 1993.</p> <p>Dr. Gilula, at this time, did not find any evidence of any other fractures in Evans' hands.
