there. That's how I would see Brian and Raven every day. It wasn't like they would be at my house.

MS. JENSEN: Does anyone else have any questions?

A GRAND JUROR: Apparently it is not hearsay when you claim that this Detective Wells offered you money?

A. No, sir. That is not hearsay. That is a straight fact.

A GRAND JUROR: Because about ninety percent of what you have told us has been street talk and hearsay?

A. Yes, sir.

A GRAND JUROR: I just want to make sure when you accuse a member of the Sheriff's Department of offering you money for testimony or for an attempt to get testimony, I want to make sure in your own mind that you are telling us the truth. It is not going to come back easy on you if you come up later and say that it was street talk like all of the rest of your comments have been.

A. No. That is a straight fact that Detective Wells offered me a thousand dollars to go up to No Doubt Tavern with a wire on and get any kind of information that I could get from Brian or Terry or Raven on a murder, drugs, or anything. I told him that I would not do that. He had my brother that you said in that statement that he went and got from Madison County Jail. He went over to the jail and got
